³ Units from a completed CCAF AAS transfer in as a block, satisfying all general education requirements with the exception of the Second Semester Language Proficiency. Students can transfer up to 75 units from CCAF and have a minimum of 45 units remaining to complete the BAS. 42 of those units must be upper division (300/400 level).

⁴ This table is based on a typical 60 unit transfer from CCAF. However, students may apply an additional 15 units of CCAF (or Arizona community college) credit to their BAS degree.
